


JUNIATA COUNTY



Juniata County has benefitted significantly from the Recovery Act. As a direct result, over 10,000 constituents received a tax cut. In addition, Juniata County has received nearly \$5 million in funding for education, transportation, and infrastructure and other projects.

Funding

The Recovery Act is helping Pennsylvania revitalize its transportation infrastructure through highway resurfacing and bridge rehabilitation projects. It is also providing funding for key infrastructure projects designed to improve water quality. **Total T& I Funding:** \$4,873,058

In addition, the Recovery Act provided direct funding for key programs and projects throughout the Commonwealth, including funds for homeless shelters and low-income housing, education programs, and job training programs. **Total Direct and Indirect Funding:** \$121,458

Total Funding: \$4,994,516

Helping Children and Families

The Recovery Act is helping those hit hardest by the economic downturn. Here is how Juniata County residents are benefiting:

- 10,028 residents of Juniata County have enjoyed federal tax relief as a result of the Recovery Act
- 1,600 jobless adults will receive a boost in unemployment compensation
- 1,000 unemployed persons qualify for more help purchasing health insurance
- 3,319 low income children and adults will continue to have access to health care through Medical Assistance
- 2,120 children and adults will receive more help through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Food Stamps)
