



Partnerships for Opportunity and Workforce and Economic Revitalization (POWER) Initiative

Projects supported by POWER grants use federal resources to target areas in the region that have been most affected by job losses in the coal industry. This is a competitive grant program and as such, the application process includes additional components and will be subject to review and scoring.

In addition to eligible projects having to address at least one of ARC’s overarching goals, priorities for POWER projects include building a competitive workforce, fostering entrepreneurial activities, developing industry clusters in communities, and broadband.

Eligible POWER projects must be located within and targeted to communities or regions that have been recently impacted (or can show that they will soon be impacted) by employment losses related to coalmining, coal-power-plant operations, or the supply-chain/logistics industries of either sector.	Grants range in size from \$50,000 for planning grants to \$1.5 million for multi-state activities* Exceptions to the award cap (up to \$2.5 million) may be made for Broadband deployment projects*	Match requirements are based on the designated status of the counties involved for the FY of project activity	Exact NOSA release dates tend to follow an annual pattern, opening in late winter and closing in early spring.
